- →
 → A desire for better connections for pedestrians, cyclists and public transport between destinations in the study area.

- A desire for additional facilities in the North Link Focus Areas, such as a botanic gardens, recreation facilities, a swimming pool and cafes.
- Concerns about safety and security, particularly for pedestrians and cyclists at night.

THE AREA PLANNING PROCESS



STAGE ONE - Closed

This was the information gathering stage, including consulting with the community. This stage of consultation closed on 30 August 2019. We are now drafting the Central Palmerston Area Plan.

STAGE TWO

An Area Plan will be drafted by the Planning Commission taking into account feedback from Stage One and other assessments.

There will be opportunities at this stage for you to comment on the draft Central Palmerston Area Plan.

Likely to occur in March 2020.

STAGE THREE

Feedback from Stage Two will be used by the Planning Commission to finalise the Central Palmerston Area Plan. The Commission will then recommend that the Minister include it in the Planning Scheme.

You will have another opportunity to give feedback on the Central Palmerston Area Plan to the Minister for Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics.
