A MESSAGE FROM THE PLANNING **COMMISSION**

The Planning Commission is starting work on an Area Plan for the Coolalinga/Freds Pass Rural Activity Centre (RAC). This detailed level of land use planning will help maintain the amenity and lifestyle of the rural area by ensuring the provision of adequate services to support growth within the boundaries of the activity centre, while helping to protect the rural area from ad hoc development in the future. The Area Plan will build on previous work and studies. It will look at current and future land uses, community needs, transport and infrastructure planning, as well as environmental and heritage values.

To assist us in preparing options for the Coolalinga/Freds Pass Area Plan, a proposed infrastructure and servicing strategy has been developed. At the same time, we want to hear from you, the land owners, residents and users of the Coolalinga and Freds Pass area, provide you information and discuss how you see Coolalinga/Freds Pass evolving into the future.

CONSULTATION FOR A DRAFT COOLALINGA / FREDS PASS AREA PLAN

The Litchfield Subregional Land Use Plan was introduced into the NT Planning Scheme in July 2016. The Subregional Plan introduced land use concept plans for Litchfield's Rural Activity Centres, including Coolalinga/Freds Pass.

The Northern Territory Planning Commission is now reviewing the concept for Coolalinga/Freds Pass and preparing detailed information on local opportunities and constraints that will contribute to providing Coolalinga and Freds Pass with appropriate infrastructure and services to support future growth.

WHAT IS AN AREA PLAN?

While the land use concept plan for Coolalinga/Freds Pass, in the subreginal plan provides a high level vision for the locality, the Area Plan will provide a decision making framework to inform future rezoning and development decisions. The additional guidance from the Area Plan will give certainty and confidence to all stakeholders, including current and future residents, landowners and investors, service providers and government agencies, to help us plan for the future. Area Plans DO NOT automatically rezone land. Any applications for rezoning must be made through the Minister responsible for administering the *Planning Act*.

HOW IT WILL BE PREPARED?

The Coolalinga/Freds Pass Area Plan will be prepared following the process below:

STAGE 1

Information gathering and analysis, including community engagement and infrastructure and servicing investigations.

Preparation of options for a draft Area Plan informed by initial community feedback and other information obtained during Stage 1, and undertake further consultation on the options

STAGE 3 Finalise a dra

Finalise a draft Area Plan and associated planning principles and recommend it to the Minister for exhibition as a proposed Planning Scheme Amendment

Stage 1 is an opportunity for you to participate in the planning process by contributing to the development of a vision to meet the future needs for Coolalinga/Freds Pass. It is intended that once all three stages have been completed the Area Plan will form part of the NT Planning Scheme.
